The Promise of Judgment upon Jerusalem

**1 ¶ Woe to Ariel, to Ariel, *the* city of
which David had encamped. Add year
upon year; let the festivals come around.**

Isaiah 29:2-3

The Punishment of Jerusalem

**2 And I will bring oppression to Ariel,
and there shall have been mourning and
grief; and it shall have been to Me as
Ariel.**

**3 And I will have encamped as a circle
against you, and I will have laid *a* seige-
mound against you; and I will have raised
up fortifications against you.**

Isaiah 29:4

The Position of Jerusalem

**4 And you shall have sunk down from the
earth; you shall speak even from the dust;
your speech shall become low; and your
voice shall have been as *a* dead spirit from
the ground, and your speech will whisper
from *the* dust.**

Isaiah 29:5-8

The Promise to Save Jerusalem

5 And the multitude of your foreigners shall have been as fine dust, and as chaff passing through of the multitude of the tyrants; and it will have been for *a* moment, suddenly;

6 you shall be visited from Yahweh of Hosts; in thunder and in earthquake, and great noise, storm and whirlwind, and *a* flame of consuming fire.

7 And the multitude of all of the nations making war against Ariel, even all making war against her and oppressing her and her stronghold, it shall have been as the dream of the vision of the night.

8 And it shall have been as when the hungry man will be dreaming; and, behold, *he is eating*; then when has been awakened and his soul *is unsatisfied*. And *it shall have been* as when the thirsty man *will be dreaming*; and, behold, *he is drinking*, then when he has been awakened then he is faint, and his soul being parched. In this way shall be the multitude of all of the nations who are making war against Mount Zion.

The Perception of the Leaders

9 ¶ Wait and be astonished! Shut your eyes, and be blind! They will have become drunk, and not from wine! They will have staggered, and not from intoxicating drink.

10 Because Yahweh will have poured out upon you *a* spirit of deep sleep, and He will close your eyes, with the prophets and your heads, the seers, He will have concealed.

Isaiah 29:11-12
The Plan of God

11 And all the vision will be to you as words of the scroll being sealed which they will give to one knowing the scroll, saying, "Please read this." And he will have said, "I am not able, because it has been sealed."

12 And the scroll will have been given over to one who will not have known the scroll, saying, "Please read this." And he will have said, "I have not known the scroll."

The Perversion of the People

Isaiah 29:15

The Rebellion of the People

15 Woe to the ones going deep to hide their plan from Yahweh; and their works will have been in *the* dark; and they will say, "who *is* seeing us?" And, "who *is* knowing us."

Isaiah 29:16

The Rejection of the People

16 Your perversion *is* as if the potter shall be valued as the clay; That the work will say to the one making it, "He has not made me," and the thing formed will have said to its Potter, "He has not understood."

Isaiah 29:17-21

The Promises of Restoration

Isaiah 29:17

The Restoration of Fruitfulness

17 Is it not yet a little while, and Lebanon shall have been turned into the fruitful field; and the fruitful field shall be considered for the forest?

Isaiah 29:18

The Restoration of Spiritual Hearing and Spiritual Sight

18 And in that day the deaf shall have heard the words of a scroll, and from out of gloom and from out of darkness, the eyes of the blind shall see

The Restoration of the Humble Ones

19 And the humble ones shall have increased joy in Yahweh, and the poor of mankind shall shout for joy in the Holy One of Israel.

Isaiah 29:20

The Restoration from the Oppressors

20 Because the tyrant will have come to *an* end, and the mocker will have been destroyed, and all the ones watching for evil will have been cut off.

The Restoration of Justice

21 The ones making a man to sin in *a* matter, and they will entrap the one reproving in the gate, and they will cause to turn aside the righteous one in vain.

The Restoration of the Honor of Jacob

22 Therefore this, Yahweh, who has redeemed Abraham, has said to the house of Jacob, "Not now will Jacob be ashamed," and "Not now will his face become pale.

Isaiah 29:23

The Restoration of Reverence for God

23 Because in seeing his children, the work of my hands, in his midst, they will sanctify my name, and they will have sanctified the Holy One of Jacob and they will reverence the God of Israel.

24 And the ones going astray in spirit shall have known understanding, and the ones complaining will learn insight
