

I am the Vine; you *are* the branches. The one remaining in Me, and I in him, this one is bearing much fruit, because separate from Me you are not able to produce, not even one thing.

Romans 8:38-39 LET

38) For I have been persuaded that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor powers, nor things having come, nor things coming,

39) nor height, nor depth, nor any other created *thing* will be able to separate us from the love of God, the one in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

Romans 8:9-11 LET

- 9) Now you yourselves are not in *the* flesh, but in *the* Spirit, if indeed *the* Spirit of God is dwelling in you. And if anyone does not have *the* Spirit of Christ, this one is not of Him.
- 10) Now if Christ is in you, on the one hand the body is dead on account of sin, but on the other hand the Spirit is life on account of righteousness.
- 11) Now if the Spirit of the One having raised Jesus from out of *the* dead is dwelling in you, the One having raised the Christ from *the* dead, will also make alive your mortal bodies through His indwelling Spirit in you.

to whom God willed to make known what *is* the wealth of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles, who is Christ in you, the hope of glory;

II Corinthians 13:5
